**Music Lessons**

**Guitar / Violin / Viola Lessons – Tutor: Tyler LaGrave**

**Target Group:** Kindergarten – 12<sup>th</sup> grade/Adult

**Class size limit:** 1-on-1 lesson

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** When it comes to learning an instrument, strings are a classic choice. Offering a wide repertoire for solo development and ensemble experiences, those who study violin, viola, and guitar come into contact with some of the best and most beloved music of all time. Individual 30-minute guitar, violin, or viola lessons consist in scale and arpeggio drills, basic music theory, basic ear training, sight reading practice, and solo repertoire. Guitar students also focus on chord memorization and chord transitions.

**Curriculum:** All course materials are to be provided or purchased by the parent. The tutor will recommend materials based on the student's level and capability. Suzuki books are often used for violin and viola solo repertoire.

**Tuition:** \$600 annually

**Supply fee:** none

**Piano Lessons – Tutor: Angie Szyman**

**Target Group:** Kindergarten – 12<sup>th</sup> grade/Adult

**Class size limit:** 1-on-1 lessons,

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** Individual 30-minute piano lessons for students will include areas of study in piano technique, ear-training and music theory, performance practice, and fun music the student may select. The student will be taught by the traditional piano teaching method of note reading on the musical staff. Improvisation is also an area the student can study if they request.

**Curriculum:** All course materials are to be provided or purchased by the student, including a lesson book, theory book, and notebook for lesson assignments. The teacher will recommend materials based on the student's level and capability.

**Tuition:** \$600 annually

## **Pre-School/Kindergarten**

### **Preschool-Kindergarten class (3 hours) – Tutor: Lynda Brock**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3, Maximum of 10

**Class type:** Full year (Open mid-year to new students if space is available)

**Class Description:** Class Description: This class is an active learning environment where we move through our mornings at the pace of the students, switching activities and pausing according to the students' level of engagement. It is important to me that class is a fun place to learn! I enjoy planning each part of our weekly times together. The students learn through lots of movement, music, stories, and games.

Each class begins with a welcome activity. This is an engaging hands on activity that invites the children to explore and creates excitement to enter into the classroom. Most of the welcome activities are process over product art projects. Some of the favorites from the last year included finger painting on aluminum foil, salt coloring with liquid water colors and droppers, painting with Pom poms, and baking soda and colored vinegar mini explosions.

During circle time we gather together to hear Bible stories of amazing Old Testament heroes and focus on the letter of the day. We sing fun songs, learn the letter of the day through games, stories and songs. I enjoy sharing a Bible story with the students each week. This year we learned of Enoch's righteousness, Noah's faithfulness, Isaac and Rebekah's generosity, and Jacob and Rachel's humility and many more. All of our Bible heroes point us to the Greatest Hero, Jesus.

In addition, our morning consists of snack and story time, outdoor games (weather permitting), music and movement, a short period of group table time, and plenty of time to play with friends.

## **Science**

### **Elementary Science (grades 1-2, 3-4, 5-7) – Tutor: Kris Johnson**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 6, Maximum of 15  
**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** In this course, we will dive into the underwater world of marine animals that God created on the Fifth day. Students will explore swimming creatures and many amazing features of how they grow and live. This class is very hands on and interactive with review of material at home and in class. Experiments will include studying how ocean currents work, how blubber insulates whales from cold and hot temperatures and involve creating a year long ocean box of the animals we will be studying.

#### **Required text for ALL grades:**

1-2<sup>nd</sup> grade class: No homework (and no Notebooking Journal required), helpful to read text with family after attending the lesson in class.

1-4<sup>th</sup> grade class: **NEW afternoon class added (minimum of 8 students required)** – same text requirements as listed above based on student's grade level.

### **Apologia General Science – Tutor: Bill Cournoyer**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3, Maximum of 20  
**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:**

This course is designed to be a systematic introduction to the sciences at the Jr. High level. This sixteen-module course covers a wide range of topics, including scientific method, designing experiments, simple machines, archaeology, geology, paleontology, biology, and human anatomy and physiology. Class time emphasis is on labs and demonstrations.

**Parent supplied text:** Apologia: Exploring Creation with General Science, 2nd Edition and coordinating test/solutions manual.

Other parent supplied items: Notebook and pencil.

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually

**Supply fee:** \$40.00 annually

**Apologia Physical Science – Tutor: Bill Cournoyer**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3, Maximum of 20

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** This is a sixteen-module course that uses the 2nd edition textbook. First semester topics include the atmosphere, hydrosphere, structure of the earth and weather. Second semester topics include Newton's laws, forces in creation, sound, light and astrophysics.

**Parent supplied text:** Apologia: Exploring Creation with Physical Science, 2nd Edition, and coordinating test/solutions manual.

Other parent supplied items: Notebook and pencil. Homework should be turned in on loose leaf lined paper.

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually

**Supply fee:** \$40.00 annually

**Apologia Biology – Tutor: Bill Cournoyer**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3, Maximum of 20

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** This is a sixteen-module course that introduces the student to the methods and concepts of general biology in the framework of the 5-kingdom classification. Topics covered first semester include Kingdoms Monera, Protista and Fungi, chemistry of life, the cell, cellular reproduction, and DNA and Mendelian Genetics. Second semester topics include evolution, ecology, and

Kingdoms Animalia and Plantae. Microscopes are used during both semesters. Dissections of a worm, crayfish, fish and frog are done during second semester.

**Parent supplied text:** Apologia, Exploring Creation with Biology, 2nd Edition

Other parent supplied items: Notebook and pencil. Homework should be turned in on loose leaf lined paper.

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually

**Supply fee:** \$40.00 annually

### **Apologia Chemistry – Tutor: Bill Cournoyer**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3, Maximum of 20

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** This is a sixteen-module course that uses the 2nd edition textbook. First semester topics include units and measurements, energy, heat and temperature, atoms and molecules, classifying matter and its changes, and balancing chemical equations. Second semester topics include polyatomic ions and molecular geometry, acid/base chemistry. Chemistry of solutions, the gases phase, thermodynamics, kinetics, chemical equilibrium and reduction/oxidation reactions.

**Parent supplied text:** Apologia Exploring Creation with Chemistry, 3rd Edition Only.

Other parent supplied items: Notebook and pencil. Homework should be turned in on loose leaf lined paper.

Prerequisites (per publisher web site): Algebra 1

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually

**Supply fee:** \$40.00 annually

### **Physics – Tutor: Bill Cournoyer**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3, Maximum of 20

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** This college-prep physics course is designed for the student who has completed algebra and has had an introduction to the definitions of sine, cosine, and tangent. It provides a detailed introduction to the methods and concepts of general physics, heavily emphasizing vector analysis; this course is ideal preparation for a university-level physics course.

This is a year-long course.

**Parent supplied text:** Apologia Physics 2nd Edition Textbook and Test Manual

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually

**Supply fee:** \$40.00 annually

## **Fine Arts**

### **Art (grades 1-2, 3-4, 5-7) – Tutor: Sandy Stauner**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3, Maximum of 20

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** Students will discover "The Joy of Art" as they are introduced to a variety of arts and art activities. This art class is designed to introduce students to artists, art history, art making, and principles of art. There are three types of lessons offered in this class: Discovering Great Artists-the study of historical figures of art and styles and techniques that characterize the artist. Elements of Art-a group of lessons which will review art basics such as color, and line and texture, and also Art Around the World, which will present artistic techniques and styles that are particularly interesting or unique. These activities are designed to encourage development of artistic vision and creative expression. Children will discover the excitement of paint, pastels, watercolors, clay and other mediums.

Supplies provided by parent: 1 box of Sharpie markers, 1 Crayola or Prang watercolor paint pallet, 2- #2 pencils, 4 Elmer's glue sticks in ziplock bag, scissors, 2-9x12 watercolor tablets, and 2 white cotton T-shirts (w/2 ziplock bags) for tie-dyeing in the spring.

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually (\$190.00 per year if 6 or less students)

**Supply fee:** \$40.00 annually

### **Mixed Media Art (grades 1-6) – Tutor: Sandy Stauner**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3, Maximum of 20

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** Mixed Media Art is "artwork where more than one media is employed." Create your own masterpiece. One of the exciting elements of mixed media is that the possibilities for creating art is unlimited! Painting, folding, glazing, cutting, sculpting, stamping, crating books, art trading cards, collages on

boards, paper, glass-using found treasures; ie: yarn, ribbon, beads, pictures, etc. Limited only by your imagination.

Additional supplies provided by parent: sharp scissors, permanent markers, bottle of glue (or 4 glue sticks), 10 brushes (nylon/taklon).

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually (\$190.00 per year if 6 or less students)

**Supply fee:** \$40.00 annually

### **Painting (grades 7-12) – Tutor: Bethany Finnern**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 5, Maximum of 16

**Class type:** Full year (open mid-year if space allows)

**Class Description:** In this year-long class students will explore acrylic painting techniques as they create 4-5 small to medium size paintings over the course of each semester. Subject material will focus on still life and landscapes.

Supply fee covers supplies to be used the entire year.

**Tuition:** \$180.00 annually (\$200.00 per year if 6 or less students)

**Supply fee:** \$80.00 annually

### **Drawing (grades 7-12) – Tutor: Bethany Finnern**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 5, Maximum of 16

**Class type:** Full year (open mid-year if space allows)

**Class Description:** In this year-long class students will be introduced to basic drawing techniques both in graphite and color pencil. The subject material will focus primarily on portraits. Students will complete between 4-5 projects over the course of each semester with the final project involving the creation of a portfolio of their work to take home.

Supply fee covers supplies to be used the entire year.

**Tuition:** \$180.00 annually (\$200.00 per year if 6 or less students)

**Supply fee:** \$40.00 annually

## Language Arts

### Poetry and Creative Writing Exploration (grades 8-12)—Tutor: Celinda Olive

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 5 students, maximum of 10

**Grade level:** 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> (8<sup>th</sup> graders will be considered)

**Description:** We will dive into the fantastic world of poetry, its genres, and poets! In addition, we will study writers who excel at fiction (novels and short stories), creative nonfiction (autobiography, memoir)—and try our hand at them all! This class is interactive, filled with lively discussion - yet nonthreatening to those who are inclined to be more shy with their words.

Parent/Student Supplies: Pen (or pencil, whichever preferred), paper, thesaurus, books TBD (no more than 2 books).

**Tuition:** \$170 annually (if class size is under 6, \$185 annual)

**Supply Fee:** \$40 annually (for copies/handouts)

### Fun with Writing (grades 1-2) – Tutor: Debbie Anderson

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 6 students, maximum of 16

**Class type:** Full year (open mid-year if space allows)

**Class Description:** “Fun with Writing” has a two-year rotation which introduces young students to the joy of writing. As imaginations are stretched and a variety of writing genres explored, beginning writers gain skills and confidence. We also read and discuss a children’s book each week at the end of class. In addition to providing solid instruction, a primary class goal is to take the edge off of common writing fears and drudgery through relationship, fun, and encouragement. This interactive class includes manageable homework assignments that are suitable for wherever your student fits on the “learning to write” spectrum.

**Tuition:** \$170 annually

**Supply fee:** \$10 annually

### Writing and Literature (grades 3-5) – Tutor: Debbie Anderson

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 6 students, maximum of 16

**Class type:** Full year (open mid-year if space allows)

**Class Description:** The 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade Writing and Literature class will present basic writing instruction for elementary students and focus on the classic short novel *The Big Wave* and *The Whipping Boy*, a Newberry Medal book. Using



questions based on a Progeny Press study guide, we will interact and discuss the story. Vocabulary, critical thinking, digging into Bible passages to help create a Christian worldview, literary terminology, short writing assignments, and a research project will all be included. The mission of Progeny Press: "To teach our children to think clearly, to understand literature, to rely on the Scripture for truth and values, and enjoy themselves while they do it!" Even if your student has already read these books, more learning awaits as we dig deeply into the story. In addition, a variety of engaging writing assignments round out the curriculum.

Required materials (provided by parent): *The Big Wave* by Pearl S. Buck, *The Whipping Boy* by Sid Fleischman, a pocket folder, pencils, and paper.

**Supply fee:** \$15.00 annually

**Writing with Style and Literature (grades 6-8) and (grades 9-12)– Tutor: Debbie Anderson**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 6 students, maximum of 15

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** This course uses an IEW student workbook (Institute for Excellence in Writing (IEW): Medieval History-Based Writing Lessons) to both introduce and/or strengthen students' abilities to create paragraph structure, essays, and story writing. Students discover and practice methods of note-taking from texts and pictures. Students are introduced to the basics of writing research paragraphs from multiple sources and how to write narrative stories. Many stylistic techniques are presented and practiced to develop voice. The basic essay structure is taught and practiced, along with a concentration on grammar skills through both the class workbook and additional sources. Vocabulary work is interwoven throughout the program and students quickly master the words. The class will also incorporate literature assignments which will be used to supplement the student's familiarity with the time period and analyze stylistic techniques. The high school class will move quicker, deeper, and include study and speaking skills.

Required Material for both classes (provided by parent):

Text: IEW's *Medieval History-Based Writing* (Student book only) Fourth Edition, Feb. 2016, \$29. Please order IEW textbook by the end of July to avoid backorders.

Supplies: Access to a thesaurus, pocket Folder, paper, highlighter.

Books: 6<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> grade - *The Great and Terrible Quest* by Margaret Lovett and *Crispin: The Cross of Lead* by Robert and Janice DeLong.

Books: 9<sup>th</sup> grade and up - Two novels, historical fiction, or biographies from the time period. Must be approved by instructor. Suggested booklist will be handed out at the beginning of class.

## **History, Geography and Social Studies**

### **American History (grades 1-6) – Tutor: Sandy Stauner**

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 6, maximum of 17  
(K graders will be considered, Talk with tutor)

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** This full year class will cover American History focusing on the Pioneer time period and themed with *Little House and the Prairie!* Returning students read three of the books from the 9 volume set. New students will still enjoy this class even if they have not read the first 3 books of the series, but they would make a great summer read! The books that we will be reading this year will include:

On The Banks of Plum Creek  
By the shores of Silver Lake  
The Long Winter  
Little Town on the Prairie  
These happy golden years  
The first four years

**Curriculum:** Parents are responsible for purchasing books or checking them out from the library.

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually (\$190.00 per year if 6 or less students)

**Supply fee:** \$20.00 per year

### **Leadership Skills (Grades 7-12) – Tutor: Julie Vrieze**

**Target Group:** 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades (6<sup>th</sup> graders will be considered. Talk with tutor)

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 5, Maximum of 16

**Class Type:** Full Year (Open mid-year to new students if space is available)

**Class Description:** Student will learn that leadership is for everyone. The first person we need to learn to lead is ourselves. Leadership is influence and is the difference maker in everything we do. Leadership habits are learned and developed through just doing a little bit each day – reading, listening, and the right association. This *Leadership Skills* class will be based on the 13 resolutions Ben Franklin wrote for himself that transformed him from being a person who people would avoid to someone who became one of the most influential leaders of all time. The 13 resolutions include: Purpose (“I resolve to discover my God-given purpose”), Character, Attitude, Vision, Plan & Do, Scoreboard, Friendship, Finance, Leadership, Conflict Resolution, Systems, Adversity Quotient, and Legacy. We will also have an occasional guest speaker.

- Students will have access to audio CDs and additional books (if desired) from the tutor’s Lending Library.
- Homework assigned outside of class will include: Listening to 1-2 audio/week, reading 15 minutes/day from class book, expanding on classroom assignments (optional)
- .
- **Curriculum:** All course materials are provided by the tutor and will be given to students the first day of the class. Students will need access to a CD player to listen to audios. Audios are geared for students who are age 12 and older.

Students need to bring a notebook, 2 pocket folder and pen to class each week.

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually (\$190.00 per year if 6 or less students)

**Supply fee:** \$60.00 annually (includes texts/workbook, handouts, lending library)

## **Logic (Grades 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>) – Tutor: Tyler LaGrave**

**Target Group:** 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 6, Maximum of 16

**Class type:** Full year

**Class Description:** Logic examines the fundamental principles of good reasoning. Though logic was once considered essential to a good education, it is now systemically omitted from many public school class catalogues. This introductory logic course will help your student properly define terms with precision and accuracy, form and interpret statements, compose valid arguments, expose invalid arguments, and identify and deflect informal fallacies.

**Curriculum:** (Parent supplied) Introductory Logic: The Fundamentals of Thinking Well by James B. Nance and Douglas Wilson (\$29 textbook and \$10 test and quiz packet). This textbook and quiz book cover the entire year. They are available for purchase at [canonpress.com](http://canonpress.com). (Please make sure to get the Introductory course

and *not* the Intermediate course .)

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually (\$190.00 per year if 6 or less students)

**Supply fee:** \$10.00 annually

### **Personal Finance & Economics (grades 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>) – Tutor: Julie Vrieze**

**Target Group:** 8<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades (parents/adults may also attend class)

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3 students, Maximum of 16

**Class Type:** Full year (also offered as a Self-Study course, talk to tutor)

**Class Description:** What makes this curriculum unique and appealing is that it begins with the 'offense' of finance rather than the 'defense', helping to create an abundance mindset versus scarcity thinking. It's rare to find a curriculum that teaches all three areas of finance in one program. The OFFENSE of finances is about making money and developing wealth thinking. The DEFENSE of finances covers budgeting & discipline. And, the PLAYING FIELD covers the rules and philosophy of money, plus simple economics.

Homework outside of class will include: listening to 1-2 audios per week from the tutor's Lending Library on Finances/Economics/Freedom, reading from the finance text book and doing the corresponding assignments for each chapter in the Financial Fitness workbook. We will occasionally watch a video in class or hear from a guest speaker to help drive home good financial stewardship.

**Curriculum:** All course materials are provided by the tutor and will be given to students on the first day of class – Supply fee includes: *Financial Fitness* textbook, workbook, 8 audio CDs, e-books, CD lending library, and other online resources to help track your progress. Students from the same family may share the textbook and audio pack, but each student will be given their own workbook.

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually (\$190.00 per year if 6 or less students)

**Supply fee:** \$60.00 annually (or \$30.00 annually for an additional family member)

### **World Geography - Places, People, & Prayers (Grades 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>) – Tutor: Mike Anderson**

**Target Group:** 8<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 5, Maximum of 16

**Class Type:** Full Year

**Prerequisite:** none

**Class Description:** Focusing mainly on world geography, this class will also look into the history and any current events of each area of the globe. We will examine the various religions--past and present--from the perspective of Christian truth.

Class discussions, reading assignments, map work, and pertinent news headlines will be included. Rather than being confined to just one textbook, this Apologia curriculum requires students to research, reason, personally apply, and record their conclusions. Recommended research sources will be provided. International guest speakers will be invited to provide an insider's look and answer questions from the class.

**Curriculum:** *Around the World in 180 Days* 2nd Edition Student Workbook

Access to an atlas, 2010 or newer (Recommended: *Rand McNally Atlas of World Geography*)

Access to encyclopedias, library, internet, or other reference sources

**Tuition:** \$170.00 annually (\$190.00 per year if 6 or less students)

## **Foreign Languages**

### **Spanish 1 (grades 4-12) - Tutor: Deanne Willman**

**Target Group:** 4<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades (3<sup>rd</sup> graders will be considered, talk with tutor)

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 6, Maximum of 15

**Class Type:** Full Year

**Prerequisite:** none

**Class Description:** ¡Bienvenidos a la clase de español! I'm very excited to work with your students to speak and understand Spanish this year! I believe language is to communicate, not just another subject to learn and check off in school. That is why your student(s) will be listening to Spanish at home and then come each week to practice speaking and understanding what they've learned at home.

In Spanish 1 you will use the Spanish in class that you have listened to at home all week to act out dramas, prepare dialogs and learn to converse with others, using costumes and props to practice. The first semester you will just listen and look at the drawings at home to understand, but the second semester you will be reading and writing Spanish! You will listen at home four days a week and come to class one day a week to practice what you've listened to. We will also learn to pronounce Bible verses well in Spanish in addition to learning useful Spanish conversation phrases.

**Curriculum:** Spanish 1 uses The Learnables 1 and Basic Structures 1 from International Linguistics Corp., [www.learnables.com](http://www.learnables.com), 1-800-237-1830. You may notice that it comes in two formats: for the computer or with CD's and a book. Either format is fine as it is the same curriculum, but you need to make sure you have some form of the audio in addition to the book.

## **Spanish 2A (grades 5-12) – Tutor: Deanne Willman**

**Target Group:** 5<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 5, Maximum of 15

**Class Type:** Full Year

**Prerequisite:** Spanish 1 or talk with teacher if coming from another curriculum

**Class Description:** ¡Bienvenidos a la clase de español! I'm very excited to work with your students to speak and understand Spanish this year! I believe language is to communicate, not just another subject to learn and check off in school. That is why your student(s) will be listening to Spanish at home and then come each week to practice speaking and understanding what they've learned at home. In Spanish 2A students sing praise and worship songs, receive a Spanish-English Bible to keep working on verses and spelling, and continue using the language in active ways. In the second year we have more assignments in both writing and speaking, using drama and demonstrations to enhance the learning and understanding of the language.

**Class size limit:** Minimum of 3, Maximum of 20

**Class Type:** Full Year

**Prerequisite:** none

**Class Description:** This will be a year long course. Almost all coding is based on a simple set of logic rules. MIT has developed a tool called Scratch that is designed to teach this logic without having to learn the specifics of a coding language. Students will learn about coding while developing their own visual interactive games and stories. The skills they learn will apply to all areas of development, including: Web, Mobile Apps, and Application Development.



Students will be required to have a laptop with wireless internet capabilities for each class. An internet connection will be provided (and supervised) in class. They will need access to the internet at home for homework assignments.
